Trench Candles for Ukraine

Over the last 3 years there has been an appeal for the collection of candles so that Trench Candles could be made and sent to the soldiers on Ukraine's front line. They are used for low level lighting and to keep their hands warm in the bitter winter there. Also thank you to all those who have responded with several loads of candles over this 3rd year, which have been taken to St Mary's Church in Arnold near Nottingham. We shall be delivering a further 25kg of wax to the Ukrainian Centre in Nottingham, making a total of well over 4,000 Trench Candles made so far. Volunteers create the candles by rolling corrugated cardboard into old baked bean tins, placing a splint into the middle, and melting the candle wax to fill the tin. Every few weeks, hundreds of candles are being sent by lorry to Ukraine, they are so very much appreciated by the Ukrainians. We all pray that this most unusual way to spread the Light of Christ to those in need of His love and care will not have to continue for too much longer. The collections are now suspended over the summer months and hopefully, the situation in Ukraine will be resolved soon.
